#### **Timeline**

- The First Industrial Revolution England 1750-1851 – market agriculture, improved transportation networks, cheap labour, mercantilism, England had established itself as a powerful nation,
  - By 1830 Britain was producing 2/3's or the world's coal, ½ of its iron and ½ of its cotton cloth

# Causes #1- Agricultural Revolution

- Innovations in animal husbandry and crop production
- Introduction of steel plough and seed drill, use of fertilizer, crop rotation
- Changes in land distribution forced many small farmers off the land and into cities
- Food production became more efficient

# #2 – Enclosure/End of Feudalism/Private Ownership

- Landlords reclaimed land rented to peasants
- Many peasants displaced and forced to leave farms for the cities

### #3 – Population Boom


- More border controls between countries less disease spreading from place to place
- Scientific Revolution improved health care and services
- Nutrition and Fertility

### #4 – The Cottage Industry

- Household manufacturing
- With the enclosure movement, farmers looked for other ways to make money. They would receive raw materials from business men, make the good and give it back to the merchant to sell


# #5 – Technological Advances – The Steam Engine

- Perfected in the early 1700's to improve manufacturing of goods
- T. Newcomen and J. Watt



### The Cotton Gin (Engine)

- Perfected in late
  1700's to remove
  seeds from the fibre
- Textile industry
- Increased need for slaves in American South


#### **Politics**
