## **Notes for Russian Revolution**

## Before the Russian Revoltion....

- -Tsarist Russia was falling economically, socially, politically
- -Tsar Nicholas II and his officials became more isolated, people lost confidence in his power
- -a council of working class leaders revolted against the government
- -Nicholas II abdicated and a provisional government was set up. Nicholas and his family were murdered a year later.

But...... Revolutionary parties wanted more......

### **Bolsheviks/Marxists**

- -revolutionary parties were divided into two groups: Mensheviks and Bolsheviks both were communist parties
- Workers saw Marxist/Socialism/Communism as attractive

## **Summer Crisis and October (Russian) Revolution**

-Lenin took over the government in November of 1917 - the worlds first Communist government was established

### **Revolution and War**

-Russia wanted a resolution to war. It wanted peace without annexations but was rejected
