The Definitions of How

Archeology: Study of material remains of the past. If there is no writing we must rely on physical remains

Anthropologist: Study the origin, development, distribution, social habits and culture of humans

Paleontology: Study of fossil remains of animals and plant life to understand past geological periods

Paleoanthropologist: Combination of the two.

Fossil: recognizable remain or impression left by them, of a plant or animal preserved in the earth's crust.

More to learn.....

Conservation technicians at the Canadian Conservation Institute, Ottawa, began preservation of artifacts to prevent disintegration after thawing.

BC government archeologists at the Royal British Columbia Museum ~ undertook further research on artifacts like the hand tool, pouch, and cedar bark hat.



Forensic anthropologists at the University of Alberta studied the human remains to determine the man's health, diet, and cause of death. Champagne and Aishihik First Nations provided the name Kwaday Dan Sinchi ("Long ago person found") and information from oral history.

Radio-carbon dating experts at a lab in Florida dated the hat and cloak to AD 1415–1445 (i.e., about 550 years old).
